Strathmiglo Conservation Community

What activity did you run?

We ran an official launch event for the group to help raise an awareness within the village of the many aspects of biodiversity which need our attention. It was also a platform where we could highlight the immediate action needed to help mitigate the effects of climate change. To do this we invited the Climate Action Fife's Development Worker - Climate Friendly Gardens and the Community Tree Planting Officer to attend and give short presentations.

Who were your main audience?

We had a wide range of attendees from primary school children to retired people, who were mostly from the community of Strathmiglo. Over 200 people attended.

What did you learn?

We learned there are many people in the village who are really interested in creating a better environment.

Has delivering your project increased capacity to tackle the climate emergency in your community?

There has been a noticeable increase in awareness within the primary school. Our group is now working alongside the school staff and children through the Eco-Committee. We have already met with them and we are putting together a plan for next year.

We have engaged with families who planted a row of 20 trees in the park. We have planted a hedgerow of 390 small trees in an adjacent greenspace and a further 50 small trees and shrubs, creating two new wildlife corridors along the A912. We have also sown a wildflower area.
